**3. Committee:** Appropriations

4. Title: Retirement System; increases amount of monthly health insurance credits.

**5. Summary:** Increases the amount of monthly health insurance credits from \$1.50 per year of creditable service to \$4.00 per year of creditable service for retired Constitutional officers and their employees, general registrars and their employees, and employees of local social services boards. The bill is not in force any time that the entire cost of the health insurance credits is not paid by the Commonwealth.

Other Comments: From Internal Impact Statement: The provisions of this legislation are not in force if the entire cost of the health insurance credit is not borne by the Commonwealth, including any time that the Appropriations Act permits the State Compensation Board to recoup the cost of the health insurance credits it pays to VRS, by withholding the amount of such cost from its payments to localities.

In addition, §51.1-1403 B has been stricken by this legislation. Paragraph B had previously addressed the "additional dollar" that the actuary would value for two localities (Pittsylvania County and the City of Roanoke).
