4. Title: Office of the State Inspector General; report on the use of seclusion and restraint in schools.

5. Summary: The bill requires the Office of the State Inspector General to review (i) the use of seclusion and restraint in public and private elementary and secondary schools and (ii) methods used in other states to reduce and eliminate the use of seclusion and restraint in public and private elementary and secondary schools. The bill requires the Office to report its findings to the General Assembly no later than the first day of the 2015 Regular Session of the General Assembly.
